COMMITTEES

Following a series of Visioning meetings held in the middle of the year four main leadership teams were set up:-

1. The Ministry Team - made up of our Incumbent, Assistant Curates, Lay Minister and Youth Worker being responsible for our worship, preaching and teaching, occasional offices, school visits in the Parish, reaching out into the Parish, especially to families, the youth and delivering pastoral care to the sick and elderly.

2. The Support Team - encompassing Steward-ship, Church buildings, Graveyards and Mill Green.

3. The Outreach Team - responsible for the Church's growing activities out into the Parish as a whole, to families, the elderly and to the youth.

4. Knowl Hill Strategy Team - responsible for developing and implementing a community-based plan for Knowl Hill based on extending church worship, integrating with school life, and organising social and fund-raising events.

The Mission Team, supporting out of Parish and overseas Mission, and the Eco-Church Team are both now standalone teams

Report of the Trustees for the year ended 31 December 2017

Achievement and performance Review of the 2017

Curates - The Revd. Hugh Barne and Revd. Steve Turville were ordained on the 1st of July 2017 and took their vows as Assistant Curates to the Parish on 2nd July 2017.

Secretary - In May 2016 Mr. Richard Lloyd stepped down as Secretary and Mr. Haydn Selwyn-Jones was appointed. Church Membership - At the April 2016 APCM the Electoral Roll was revised, and increased from 253 to 261 names. The usual Sunday attendance is still around 120 adults and 20 children in Wargrave, and 15 adults in Knowl Hill / Warren Row. The PCC met 6 times during the year with an average attendance of 78%. Committees/Ministry Teams met between meetings, and their meeting minutes were received by the full PCC and their recommendations to be discussed and acted upon.

Much voluntary work on the buildings and grounds has kept costs to a minimum. The detached Churchyard extensions of both Churches are now being mostly maintained by additional support from their local communities, both financially and with volunteer labour.

Work continued on defining and implementing the proposed extended facilities and accommodation at St. Mary's to meet changing needs. The audio/visual system installed last year has proved a very positive benefit in developing our services enabling screen displays for hymns and information during services and the recording and filming of services and events. Detailed discussions with con-tractors, The Local Authority and with English Heritage have continued over the design of an Annexe on the north side of the Church. Progress has been made on the St Mary's Church Centre project and considerable activity has taken place to ensure that the faculty process could move ahead. Substantive work commenced in early 2018, and completion of the shell is expected by the end of May 2018. In order to finance all this work, the 21st Century Project Appeal fund now stands at around £300,000 compared to a budgeted total cost of £420,000.

Financial review

The year's Financial Accounts show that a surplus of £29,911 before fund transfers was recorded on unrestricted income and expenditure. There was a 13.5% increase in Stewardship Income, including Gift Aid, following a campaign to raise regular giving in the year. Overall, income including restricted funds was reduced by 17%, mainly due to fewer contributions in the year for the St Mary's Church Centre project compared with the prior year, although this was partially offset by an increase in fundraising income from the Festival events. Due to changes in the allocation of the Parish Share assessment there was a decrease of 5%, but there was an overall increase of 27% in expenditure mainly due additional clergy expenses (provision of accommodation for the new curate), employment of a youth worker and major repairs on the boiler. Fundraising costs, mainly associated with the Festival events, was also much increased in the year there was also additional expenditure on the restricted funds, particularly on AV equipment modification.

The PCC's policy is to invest any surplus cash in the Central Board of Finance deposit fund. Endowment funds are invested in the COIF or CBF Investment Funds managed by CCLA Investment Management Ltd on behalf of the Trustees. Unrestricted balances are either designated for use against future repairs or used to smooth income fluctuations and are on deposit or in working capital.

Other matters

The Parish Health and Safety Policy continues to operate so that for all significant areas of activity, risk assessments are undertaken and monitored. A Safeguarding Policy is in place, initially for work with children and young people, but has now been extended to cover work with vulnerable adults as well.

St. Mary's continues to support several external causes with the Mission Ministry Team providing information, and coordinating prayer and financial support. Tearfund, Yeldall Christian Ministries, London City Mission, and Faith Christian Group and CCA, both of which are in Reading and are the most notable causes. Support was also given to 2 congregation members undertaking evangelistic and training projects with Youth with a Mission and Operation Mobilisation.

Mid-week activities flourish around the parish, with several House Groups meeting regularly for prayer, study and fellowship. Courses on Christianity Explored, Discipleship Explored and Life Explored were held. Under the auspices of the Ministry Team, a growing number of services of worship and Holy Communion have been held at retirement homes and for the housebound.

The work of our new Youth Worker, alongside our Ministry and Outreach has resulted a positive increase in work among children and young people, enhancing the amount of contact with the children in the Parish.

The Knowl Hill Strategy Team under the leadership of the Churchwardens has continued to build on working with the Village Association on social events and on making the Church an accessible place with special services, such as Village Praise on the first Sunday of every month providing a focus. The link with the local Primary School - a joint Academy with White Waltham school - has been significantly extended making use of the additional space in Church created by the removal of three pews, and the construction of a direct gateway and pathway between the school and the Church.

Other matters (cont'd)

The reorganisation of the work pattern in the busy Parish Office has continued to be successful, supported by voluntary support. Jane Wills was re-appointed as Treasurer and continues to provide the PCC with regular accounts and reports. The Parish Magazine in full colour, along with its availability on the Website, continues to be well received and continues to bring in a profit.

Peter Dart as Director of Music continues to plan and lead the musical worship of the main morning services at St. Mary's and for additional festivals such as the Christmas Carol Service and the Concert in November, with strong input from local schools. The singing group provides positive leading for our worship through their singing and instrumental participation. The Parish Roadmap which was established in 2009 continues to act as the overall strategic plan under a new vision for the church to be "A church at the heart of our community" and the Parish Ministry Teams are undertaking to carry out a number of fresh of initiatives following our PCC Visioning day to review and revitalise the work towards its long term objectives.

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Notes to the Financial Statements for the year ended 31 December 2017

1. Accounting policies

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Church Accounting Regulations 2006 together with the Charities SORP (FRS102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) (effective 1 January 2016)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention with the exception of Investments which are included at market value.

The financial statements include all transactions, assets and liabilities for which the PCC is responsible by law. They do not include the accounts of church groups that owe their main affiliation to another body, nor those that are informal gatherings of church members.

Financial reporting standard 102 - reduced disclosure exemptions

The charity has taken advantage of the following disclosure exemptions in preparing these financial statements, as permitted by FRS 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland':

- the requirements of Section 7 Statement of Cash Flows;
- the requirement of Section 3 Financial Statement Presentation paragraph 3.17(d);
- the requirements of Section 11 Financial Instruments paragraphs 11.41(b), 11.41(c), 11.41(e), 11.41(f), 11.42, 11.44, 11.45, 11.47, 11.48(a)(iii), 11.48(a)(iv), 11.48(b) and 11.48(c).

Income

Voluntary income and capital sources:-

Collections are recognised when received by or on behalf of the PCC. Planned giving receivable under covenant or pledge is recognised only when received. Tax recoverable on Gift Aid donations is recognised in the period in which the qualifying donations are received. Grants and legacies to the PCC are accounted for as soon as the PCC is notified of its legal entitlement, the amount due is quantifiable and its ultimate receipt by the PCC is reasonably certain.

Other income:-

Rental income from the letting of church premises is recognised when the rental is due. Funds raised by church social events and other activities and from the sale of books and magazines are accounted for gross.

Dividends and interest are accounted for when received.

Gains and losses on investments:-Unrealised gains or losses are accounted for on revaluation of investments at 31 December 2017

Donated goods and gifts in kind are measured at fair value (the amount for which the asset could be exchanged) unless impractical to do so.

Expenditure

Grants and donations are accounted for when paid over, or when awarded, if that award creates a binding or constructive obligation on the PCC. The diocesan parish share is accounted for when due. Any parish share unpaid at 31 December is provided for in these financial statements as an operational (though not a legal) liability and is shown as a creditor in the balance sheet. Amounts received specifically for mission are dealt with as restricted funds. All other expenditure is generally recognised when there is a legal and constructive obligation to pay out resources, and the amount can be measured with reasonable certainty. The value of any voluntary help received is not included in the accounts but is described as appropriate in the trustees' annual report.

Notes to the Financial Statements - continued for the year ended 31 December 2017

1. Accounting policies - continued

Tangible fixed assets

Consecrated and beneficed property of any kind is not included in the accounts in accordance with section 10(2)(a) of the Charities Act 2011. Movable church furnishings held by the vicar and churchwardens on special trust for the PCC and which require a faculty for disposal are inalienable property, listed in the church's inventory, which can be inspected (at any reasonable time). For inalienable property acquired prior to 2003 there is insufficient cost information and therefore such assets are not valued in the financial statements.

Equipment used within the church premises is depreciated on a straight-line basis over the estimated useful life of the asset where the asset is readily identifiable as separate to the buildings or fabric thereof. Individual and separable items of equipment with a purchase price of £1,000 or less are written off when the asset is acquired.

Investments, COIF shares and UK stocks & shares are valued at market value at 31 December 2017

Tavation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Value added tax

The Charity is not registered for VAT and accordingly, where applicable, all costs and expenditure incurred are accounted for inclusive of VAT.
